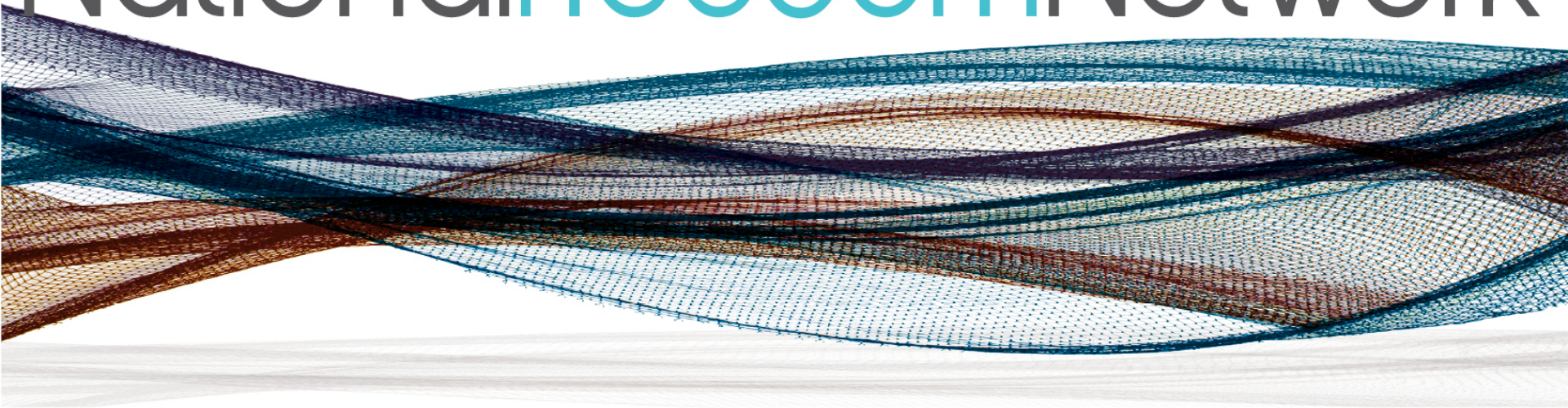


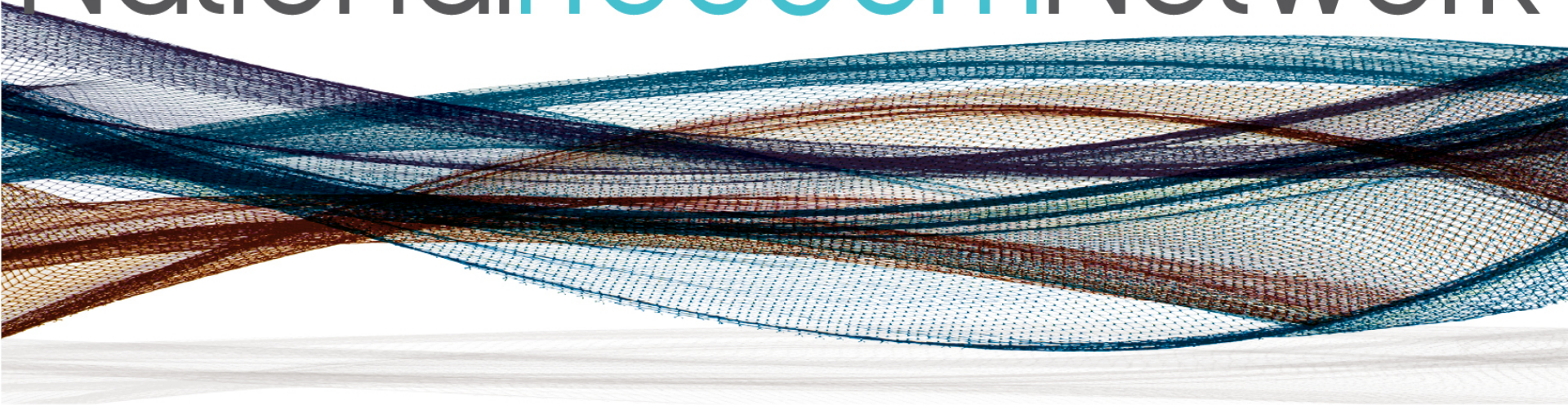

Background



BACKGROUND

At the end of 2009 a Symposium was held at the British High Commission to engage relevant high level stakeholders on the topic of Human Trafficking. Cheri Blair was the guest speaker and the event was made possible by Thare Machi Education. One of the outcomes of the event was the need for all the parties that play a role in preventing and dealing with Human Trafficking to work together nationally as the nature of the crime requires a joint response if it is to be addressed effectively. During 2010 research and strategic workshops were conducted to determine a base for the network and to identify which critical gaps and strategic imperatives should be addressed. The NFN was formally launched in 2011.

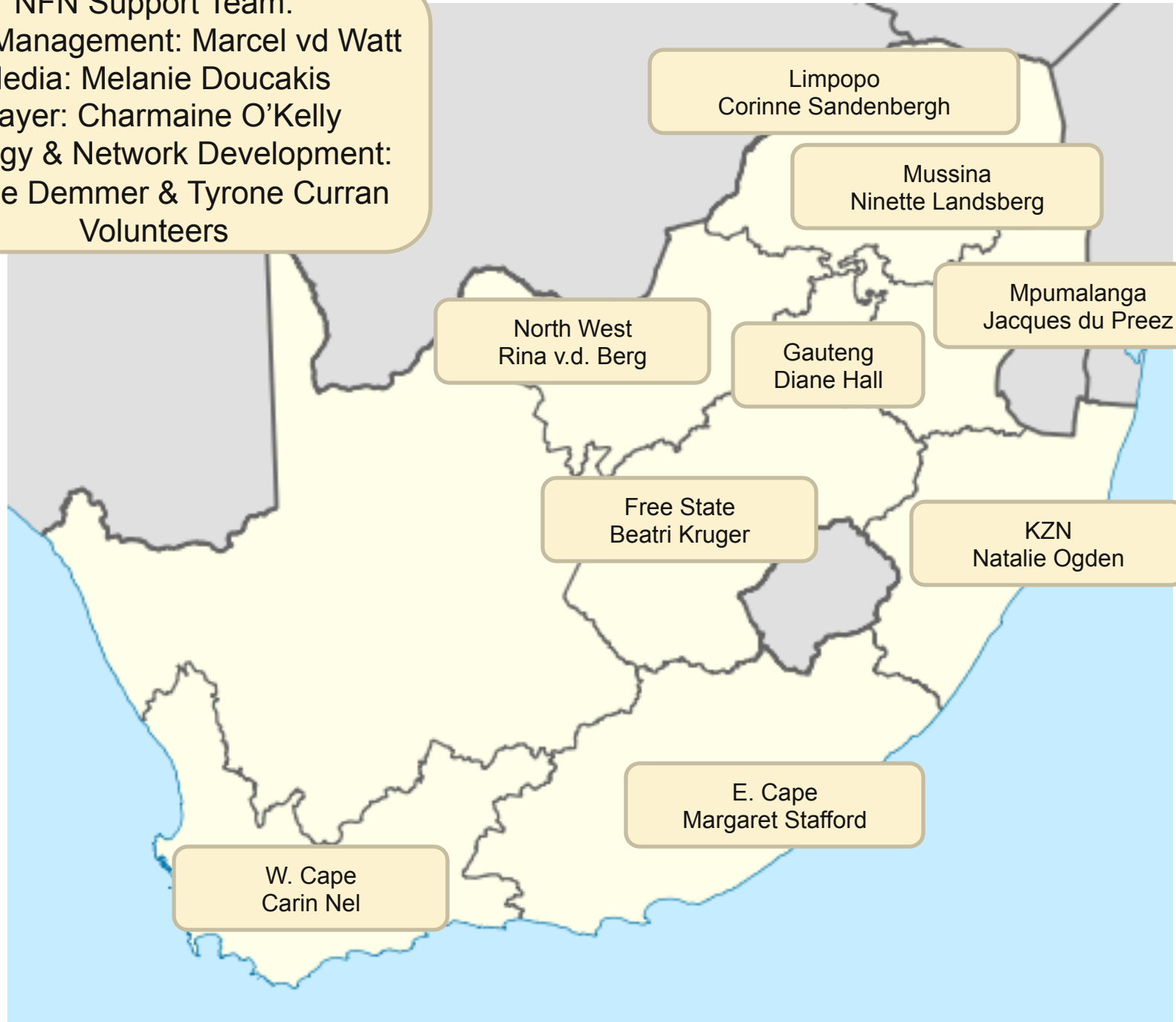

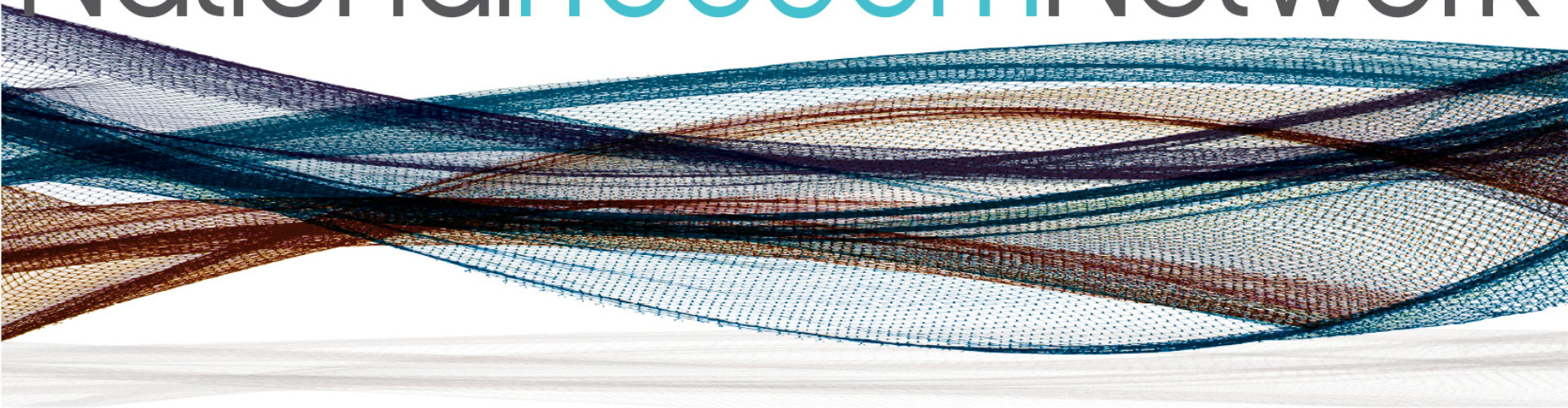

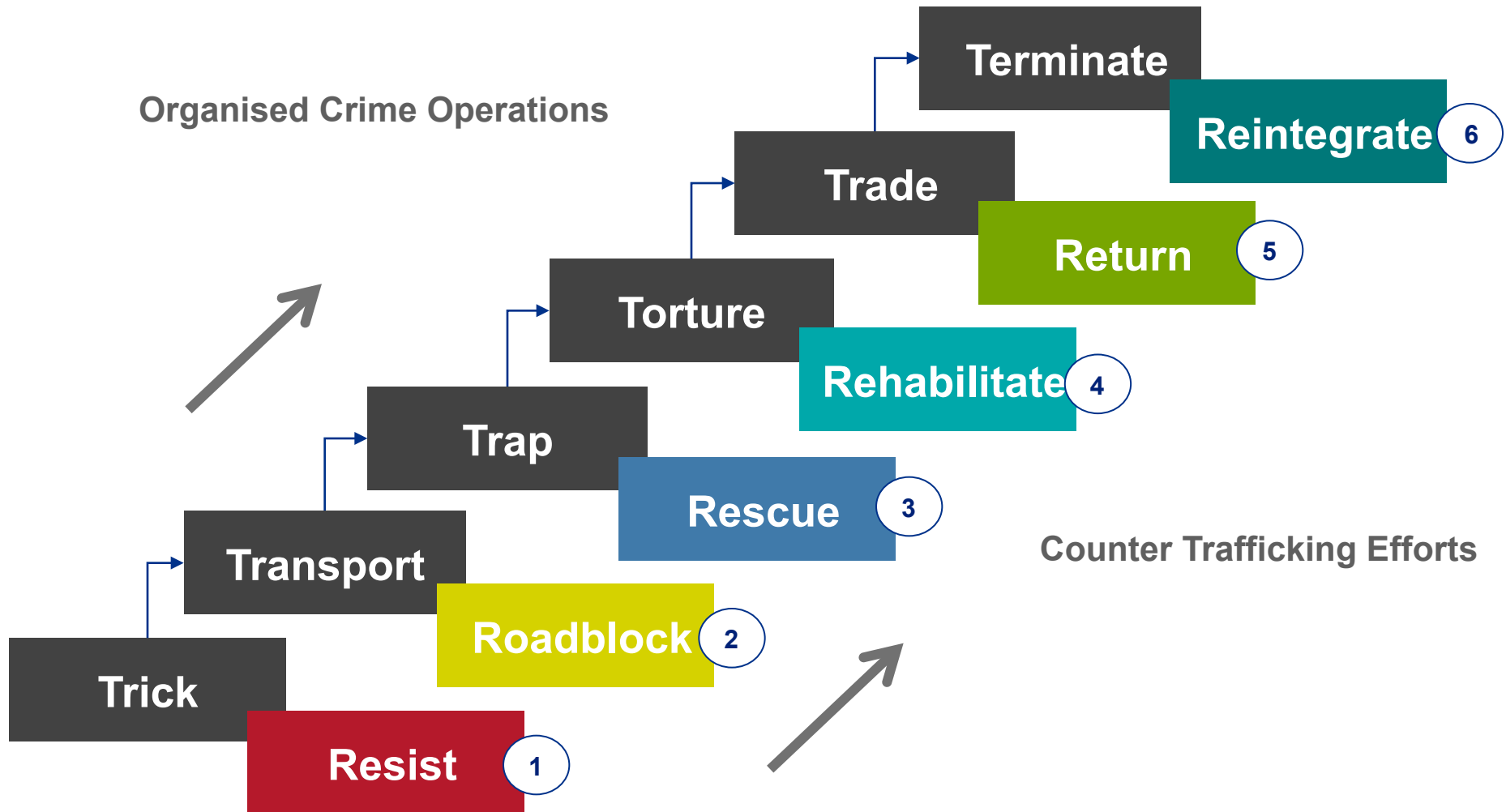

Structure of the NFN 'Backbone'

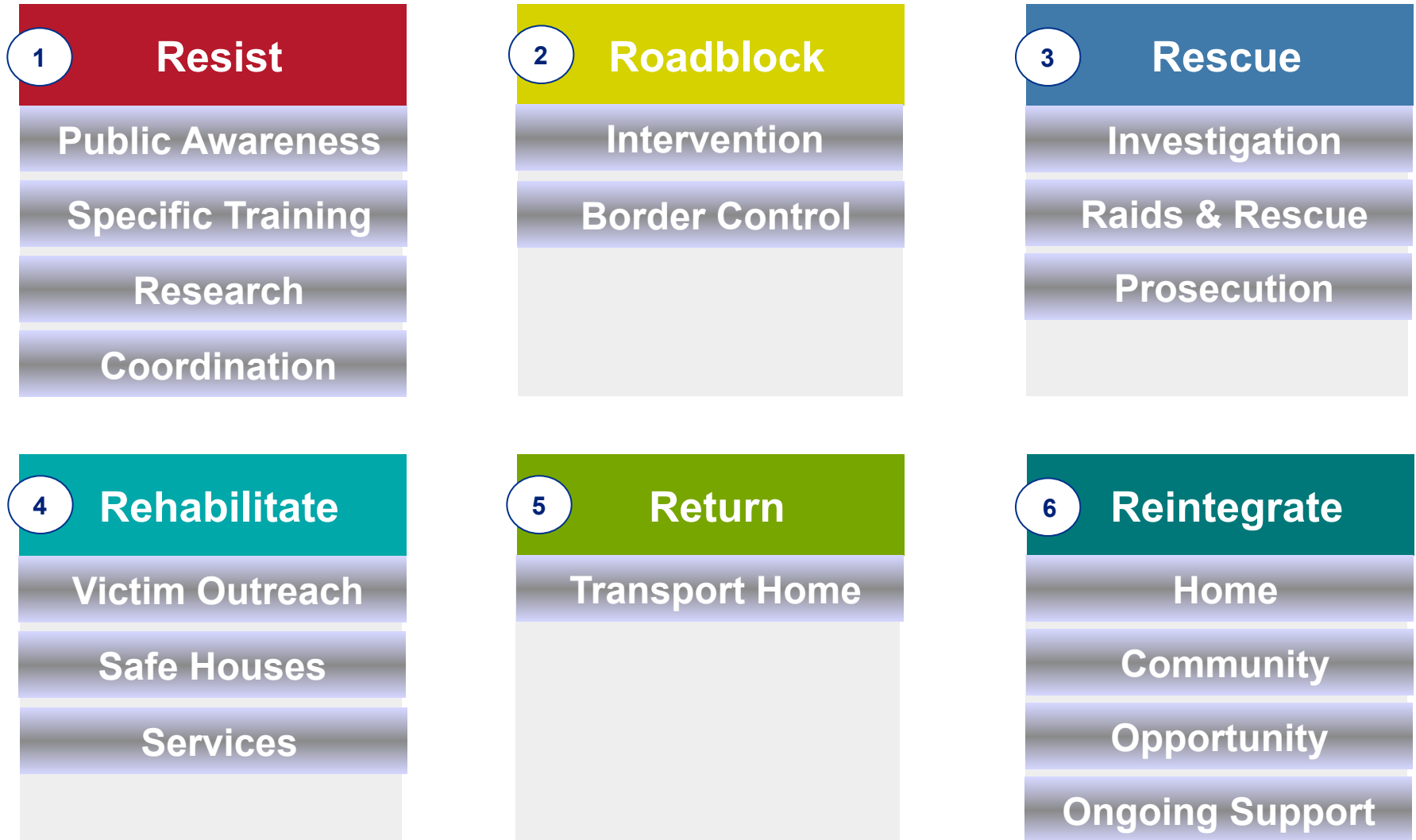

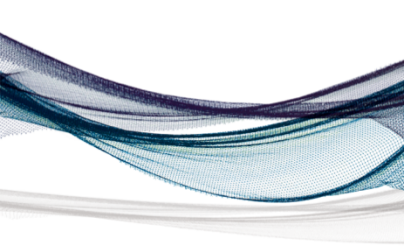




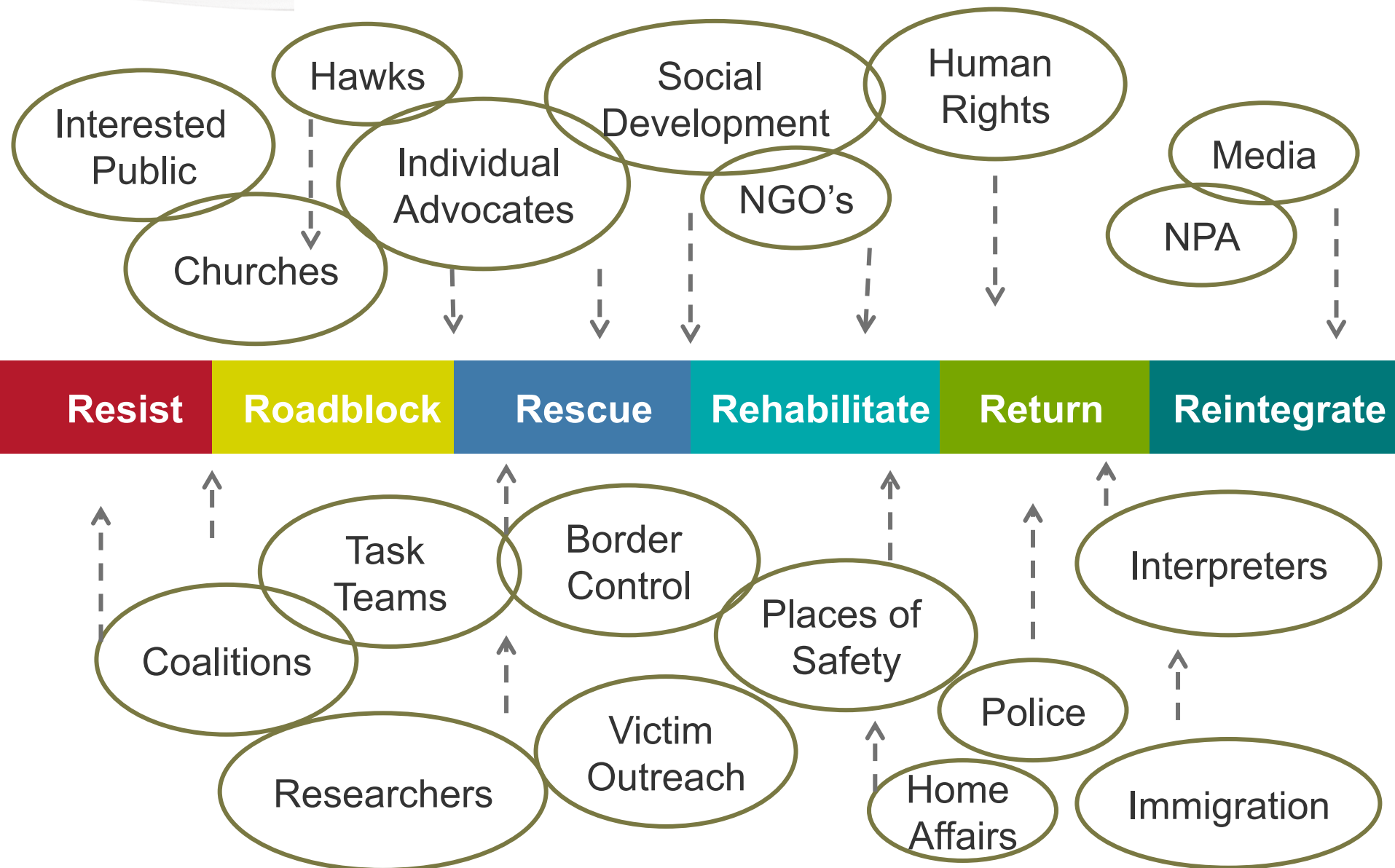
NFN Programme Cycle

All the member organisations are slotted in according to their programmes and services





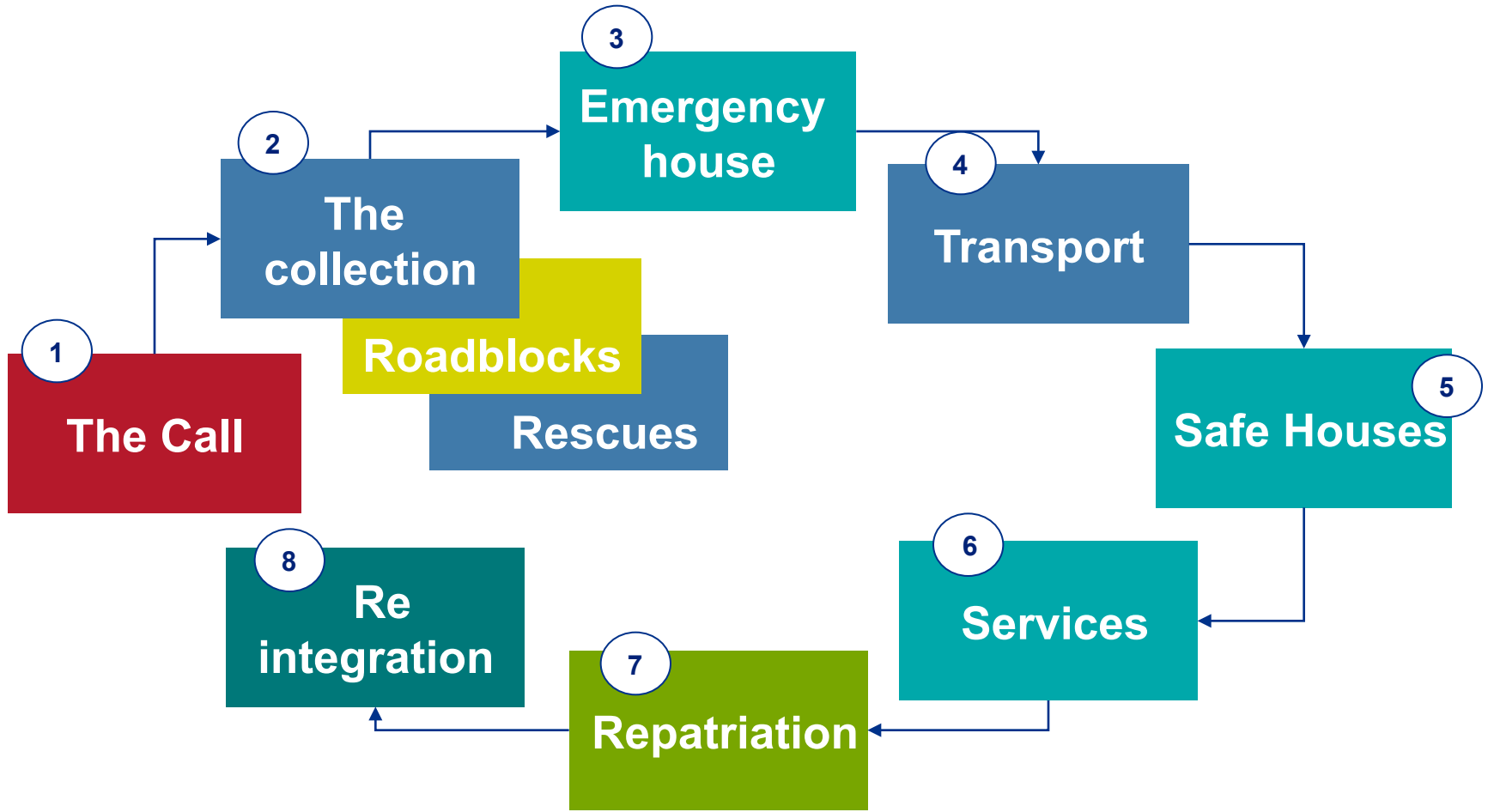
Integration into the 'Backbone'



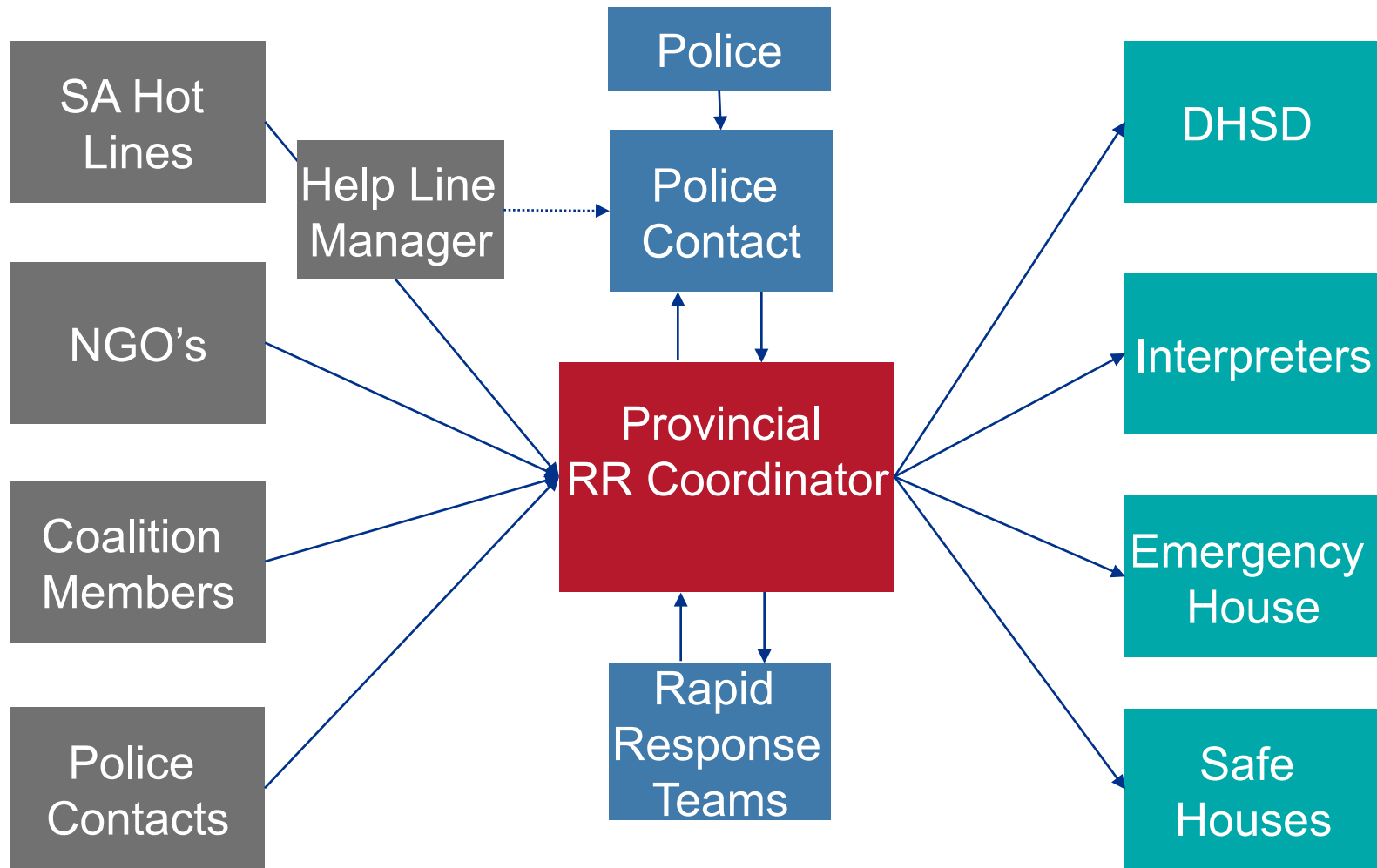


Rapid Response Cycle (RR)

Services that relate to victims are ordered according the cycle of rescue and care



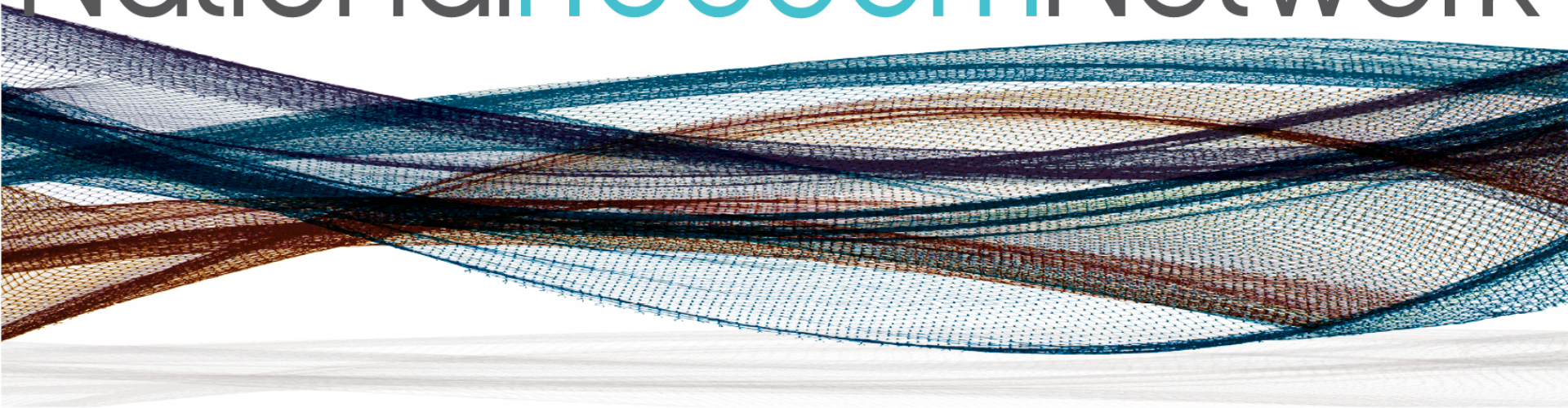
Coordination of Activities

Advocacy objectives – scope increase

- Have a counter trafficking training DVD in every school
- Integration of operations, develop one strategy blueprint and action plan
- TIP Industry news
- Mapping of members - Implement 'Freedom Registry' to create visibility of the network

Advocacy objectives – scope increase

- Target the supply chain. Housing, transport, adverts, etc.

Strategy objectives – fill the gaps

- ‘Early identification of victims’ and protocol training for law enforcement and staff at points of entry. Borders, ports, airports, on planes, taxis etc.



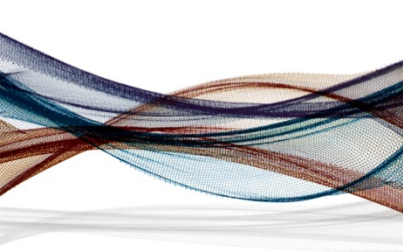
Advocacy objectives – scope increase

- Encourage local and international pressure to pass the counter trafficking laws
- Address the prostitution laws from the TIP perspective
- Explore the links to drug trafficking & money laundering

Strategy objectives – fill the gaps

- Encourage communities to identify recruiters and protect their community
- Detail what is needed to implement the trafficking laws





Advocacy objectives – scope increase

- Meet the special needs of the 10-18 year old child victim
- Enlist partners that are competent in drug rehab
- Place of safety for men and boys victims

- 72 hour emergency safe houses that are immediately accessible for housing and statements

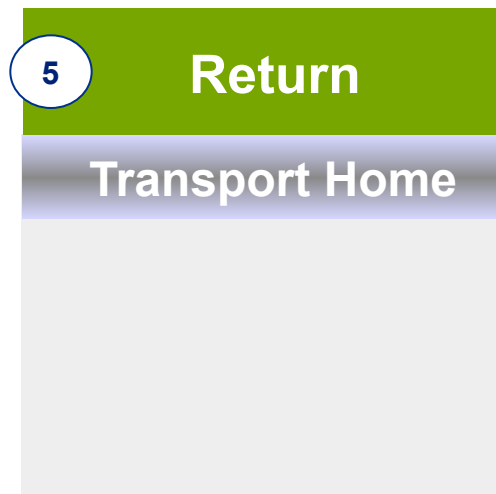


Advocacy objectives – scope increase

- Have partners in home countries meet victims at airport and conduct debriefing sessions





Advocacy objectives – scope increase

- Determine economically viable employment options
- For the victims to receive rehabilitation in a safe house in country of origin where culture and language is understood

Strategy objectives – fill the gaps

- Have partners in home countries assist with reintegration where needed
- Send victims home with opportunities for income generation

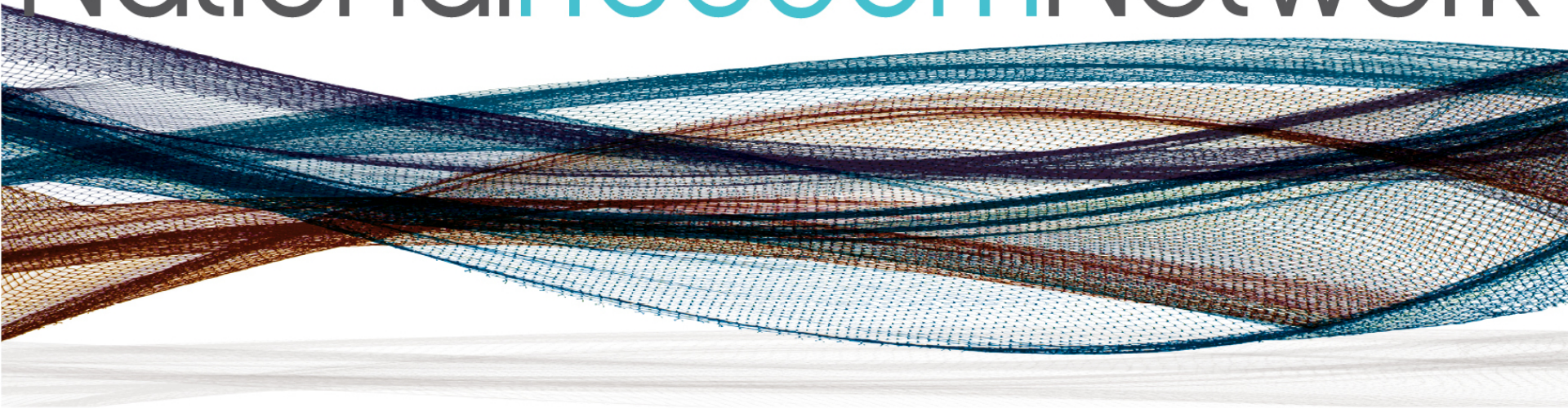
