

### **BACKGROUND**

At the end of 2009 a Symposium was held at the British High Commission to engage relevant high level stakeholders on the topic of Human Trafficking. Cheri Blair was the guest speaker and the event was made possible by Thare Machi Education. One of the outcomes of the event was the need for all the parties that play a role in preventing and dealing with Human Trafficking to work together nationally as the nature of the crime requires a joint response if it is to be addressed effectively. During 2010 research and strategic workshops were conducted to determine a base for the network and to identify which critical gaps and strategic imperatives should be addressed. The NFN was formally launched in 2011.














# Rapid Response Cycle (RR)

■ 'Early identification of victims' and protocol training for law enforcement and staff at points of entry. Borders, ports, airports, on planes, taxis etc.



- Encourage local and international pressure to pass the counter trafficking laws
- Address the prostitution laws from the TIP perspective
- Explore the links to drug trafficking & money laundering


